DURHAM -- As part of the Durham Art Guild's Member Artist Residency Program, and in partnership with Golden Belt, DAG Artist Residency recipient Ed Larson will be collecting submissions from Durham residents and visitors for his community-based art project, called "A Matter of Scale."

Community participants are asked to relate to this quote from novelist E. M. Forster: "To make us feel small in the right way is a function of art; men can only make us feel small in the wrong way."

Participants are asked to submit experiences when you felt small, whether humbled or defeated. Your submission may remain anonymous or you may include your contact information. Selected entries will be integrated, altered or otherwise assembled, into a larger artwork, built of many of these smaller related moments.

Submissions may be dropped in boxes located at the artist's studio on Golden Belt's campus at 807 E. Main St. during the Durham Art Walk Saturday and Sunday, Third Friday Events, or any time at the Durham Art Guild CCB Gallery located within the Durham Arts Council Building at 120 Morris St. Hours for the DAG Gallery are Monday-Saturday from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Sunday from 1 to 5 p.m. Deadline for submissions is May 22.

This community project piece, as well as Larson's other works produced during his DAG Member Artist Residency at Golden Belt, will be exhibited at the Durham Art Guild's gallery at 120 Morris St. The community piece will be donated to the Durham Art Guild and will be available for future exhibits within the community.
