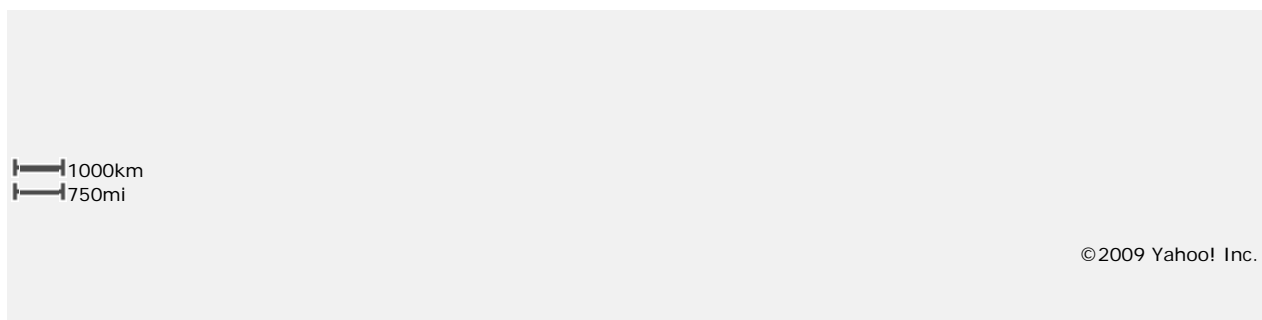

The first (and perhaps only) biennial in response to the current economic crisis and scandals surrounding the \$700+ billion bailout, capitalism, the global economy, post-industrialism and greed. Unlike most, this biennial came together from a simple call for submissions, has no budget and will require plywood sheets to be screwed into 1900s-era wooden pillars at Golden Belt--a restored textile mill in downtown Durham--to make walls for the art. Can an artist make beauty out of nothing, humor out of tragedy, critical understanding out of superficial materials, or a sense of wonder, purpose or awe out of crumbs? Come and see for yourself.
